

Report

A Free Eye Treatment Camp was organised in the Physics Lab on Friday, 11th August 2023 to check the eyesight of all the Teaching and Non-Teaching faculty members of Kings College of Engineering. Under the able guidance of our Principal, Dr.J.Arputha Vijaya Selvi, the camp was jointly organised by National Service Scheme of our college and Joseph Eye Hospital, Trichy. The event was facilitated by Dr.R.Rajendran, Secretary, Raj Educational Trust and Mr.Jayachandran, Amman Agencies (Pharmaceuticals distributors). The main aim behind organizing this eye camp is to provide the members various services like eye care education, full eye checkups, medical care and to prevent the people from getting major eye disorders.

The camp started at 9:30am and lasted till 2:30pm. The eye sights of 142 Teaching and Non-Teaching faculty members were tested in the presence of Dr.Shejin Sweety, Ophthalmologist and J.D.Samuel Wrinkler, optometrist and their team members. The eye tests were conducted in three stages and those who were found to have weak eyesight were advised about the importance of wearing spectacles on a regular basis to protect their precious eyes. All the arrangements of the camp were made by NSS programme officers Mr.G.Dinesh and Mr.S.Ambalatharasu.

The event was a fruitful one as many Teaching and Non-Teaching faculty members were benefited from the eye check-up. The event not only helped to prevent the further deterioration of the eyesight of the participants but also provided a sense of relief to them.





Report

The National Deworming Day (NDD) is an initiative of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India to make every child in the country worm free. This is one of the largest public health programs reaching large number of children during a short period. This Program is being implemented by the state since 2015. In government, government-aided, Anganwadi, private, and other educational institutions, children and adolescents receive one dose of the safe medication Albendazole. An evidence-based, widely accepted, and efficient method for reducing worm infections in all children is albendazole deworming.

In line with the initiatives, National Deworming Day was observed by National Service Scheme of our college on August 17, 2023, from 11.30 am to 12.30 pm. As part of the programme, the students were supplied with deworming tablets to consume under the supervision of the Mr.Thirunavukkarasu, Health Inspector, Pudhunagar and Mrs.Angayarkarasi, Staff Nurse, Pudunagar. 280 students consumed the deworm tablets. Earlier a health talk regarding the causes of signs and symptoms, management and preventive aspects of the worm infestation was delivered by Mr. S. Ambalatharasu, NSS PO / Unit II. All the arrangements for the programme was made by Mr.G.Dinesh, NSS PO / Unit I.

Outcome

The students came to know about those who have worms have trouble absorbing nutrients, which can lead to anemia, malnutrition, and delayed development of the mind and body. And they also became aware of how to reduce worm infections.

REPORT





Day 2-30.04.2024 - First Aid Camp



Day 4-02.05.2024 - Free Dental Camp & Community Awareness about Electricity


Free Dental Camp was organized on the morning session of the fourth day in order to integrate oral health promotion and to prevent oral diseases. NSS Students participated in the programme and gained knowledge. The event began with the welcome address by Mr.G.Dinesh, NSS PO/Unit I. On this occasion **Dr.T.Stalin, Dentist, Thanjavur, visited and mentored the participants.** In his talk, he informed that tooth decay and gum disease are caused by plaque, a sticky combination of bacteria and food. By taking good care of our teeth and gums, we can help prevent problems such as tooth decay and gum disease. Then he examined all the participants scrupulously with great care. He also asked the volunteers to create awareness among the children how to brush and floss from an early age to help them protect their teeth. The session concluded with thanksgiving by Mr. S. Ambalatharasu, NSS PO / Unit II.

The afternoon session was handled by Mr.Sundaramoorthy, AP, Kings College of Engineering on 'Community awareness about electricity'. He informed the participants on the merits and demerits of electricity and the advantage of Light emitting diode at our home to reduce the power consumption. However, he mentioned to make use of electricity judiciously. He also pointed out the alternate sources for power generation like solar, biogas., etc. Finally, he made basic questions about electricity and appliances.

Outcome

At the end of the programme students are able to identify the normal structures of oral cavity, differentiating the primary and permanent teeth. And they have also learned how to maintain dental health and to prevent from oral diseases.









DAY 5-03.05.2024 - Free Doctor Mohan's Diabetes Camp

A Free Diabetes Special Camp was organised on the fifth day of the morning session in association with **Doctor Mohan's Diabetes Centre, Thanjavur** for the benefit of the people in Meikudipatti. A team of one doctor and one technician conducted the camp. Earlier the doctor informed the participants that diabetes being a lifelong debilitating disease with widespread medical and social ramifications, demanding high degree of discipline on the part of the patients and health professionals alike, such organised health maintenances and promotional activities may contribute to the improvement of the health and overall well being of individuals (in the early tender years and prime of life) with diabetes, betterment of family welfare may also be anticipated.

Later of the day Computer Training Programme for School Students was organised with a noble view of educating the village school students on computer skills to adopt to new world of education, our volunteers selected school students from Meikkudippatti and brought them to our college computer lab where all the students were given individual system to gain knowledge, volunteers guided students to operate systems and taught Microsoft office, painting, etc. This initiative of our students, made the participants happy in the way the computer basics were given to them by our staff and volunteers.

Lecture on Blood Donation Awareness Talk was given to the volunteers in the evening session. The Medical College Blood Bank Team, Thanjavur, visited and discussed the different kinds of blood that existing in our body and what makes our blood different from someone else's is our unique combination of protein molecules, called antigens and antibodies. They also informed that the combination of antigens and antibodies in our blood is the basis of our blood type. Further they highlighted that the actions of donating blood and caring for the planet are directly linked to self-love; donating blood brings several advantages for the human being, it reduces the risk of suffering a heart attack or a stroke and improves the blood circulation process, allowing the regeneration and oxygenation of the body tissues. In addition, it can be a way to check that our health status. Finally all the doubts raised by the participants were clearly explained.

Outcome

The day was helpful in many ways to the village people and the volunteers. They were diagnosed and were informed how to keep their blood glucose level, also called blood sugar to lead a healthy life.

The eye tests were conducted in three stages and those who were found to have weak eyesight were advised about the importance of wearing spectacles on a regular basis to protect their precious eyes.

Free Medical Consultation was organised in the afternoon session. The session was handled by Dr. Sasivarman, Pudunagar. He started the session by enlightening the gathering about the true purpose of a volunteer. According to him, a volunteer is the one who volunteer to work for a cause without expecting any return or reward. He talked about various aspects of being a NSS volunteer and the need for a well trained volunteer. Then he insisted the participants about how keeping good health is helpful to both individual and society. He also explained the importance of various fats, minerals, healthy sleeping habits and harms of skipping meals.

The day was a fruitful one as many village people were benefited from the eye check-up. The event not only helped to prevent the further deterioration of the eyesight of the participants but also provided a sense of relief to them.

OBJECTIVE OF NCC FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2023-24

The overall objective of NCC is to "Trained **And Motivates the Youth to Serve the Nation**". The motto of the NCC is "**Unity and Discipline**" (Ekta aur Anushasan). KCE has the pride and privilege to have efficient cadet in flight consisting 50 in number and one associate NCC officers. The cadets are enrolled from the first year students. The cadets are expected

- To develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship and the ideals of selfless service among the youth to make them useful citizen.
- ❖ To create a human resource of organised trained and motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks of life including the Armed Forces and be always available for the service of the nation.

The activities under NCC can broadly be divided into two major categories

1. Regular Parade activities:

The regular parades are carried out in a systematic way, with much preparation so as, to have a clear outlook of the Indian defense(Army ,Air force, Navy) . The parade consists of the one ANO, NCC cadets, Permanent instructor from Indian air force . The main objective is to train cadets in Drill, shooting, Physical fitness, map reading, First aid, Gliding/Flying, boat pulling, sailing and camp training covering basic of military training in Army, Navy and Air Force.

This training is mostly carried out in schools and colleges by the cadets. In addition, depending upon the type of service, basic knowledge of that service is imparted to the cadets e.g gliding, powered flying for Air Wing cadets and boat pulling, sailing for Naval Wing cadets form part of institutional training. These activities comprise approximately 50% of the entire syllabus.

2. Camp Activities:

In CAMP, the boys(Senior & Junior Division)and girl cadets(Senior & Junior Wing)of a particular NCC unit participate in the 10-day camp. Classes are conducted as per the given syllabus wherein certain aspects of NCC training are taught once again. The camp acts as a refresher training for the cadets and they are also trained in basic skills of survival and emergencies besides other topics. They are taught certain skills pertaining specifically to their Wing for e.g., a Naval cadet is trained in boat-rowing, oaring, Semaphore, etc. Another activity in the camp is the "dogwatch" wherein two cadets are to stay on sentry duty for two hours at any time given time of the day. Those caught sleeping, especially during late night or early morning shifts, or otherwise missing from duty are severely reprimanded or penalized. Cadets are also introduced to weapons such as a .22 caliber rifle.


Concept Map for Biodiversity Depletion:




